7. I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life. (St. John 8:12)
8. I am the bread of life. (St. John 6:48)
9. I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live. (St. John 11:25)
10. I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. (St. John 10:11)
11. I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but by me. (St. John 14:6)
12. The Son of man is lord of the sabbath. (St. Matthew 12:8)
13. St. Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" (St. John 20:28)
14. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus. (1 Timothy 2:5)
15. All things have been delivered to me by my Father. (St. Matthew 11:27)
16. He who abides in me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. (St. John 15:5)
17. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them. (Hebrews 7:25)
18. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. (St. John 3:16)

19. He who believes in the Son has eternal life; he who does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God rests upon him. (St. John 3:36)
20. God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. (1 Corinthians 1:9)
21. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. (St. John 3:17)
22. The Father loves the Son, and has given all things into his hand. (St. John 3:35)
23. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily. (Colossians 2:9)
24. You have come to fullness of life in him, who is the head of all rule and authority. (Colossians 2:10)

5. Holy Spirit

1. A new heart I will give you and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will take out of your flesh the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. (Ezekiel 36:26)
2. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days. (Joel 2:29)
3. Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. (St. John 3:5)
4. No one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Jesus be cursed" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. (1 Corinthians 12:3)
5. And when he comes, he will convince the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment. (St. John 16:8)
6. God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us. (Romans 5:5)
7. The Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words. (Romans 8:26)
8. The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. (Galatians 5:22-23)
9. And we all are being changed into his likeness from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit. (2 Corinthians 3:18)
10. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. (Romans 8:9)
11. Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God. (Ephesians 4:30)
12. Do not quench the Spirit. (1 Thessalonians 5:19)
13. For the kingdom of God is not food and drink but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. (Romans 14:17)
14. Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? (1 Corinthians 3:16)

15. No prophecy ever came by the impulse of man, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God. (2 Peter 1:21)
16. You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth. (Acts 1:8)
17. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. (Acts 2:4)
18. We are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him. (Acts 5:32)
19. Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit. (Acts 8:17)
20. How much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him? (St. Luke 11:13)
21. I will pray the Father, and he will give you another Counselor, to be with you for ever. (St. John 14:16)
22. It is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Counselor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. (St. John 16:7)
23. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth. (St. John 16:13)
24. But when the Counselor comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness to me. (St. John 15:26)
25. The spirit of God has made me, and the breath of the Almighty gives me life. (Job 33:4)
26. God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. (1 Corinthians 2:10)
27. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit. (1 Corinthians 12:8)
28. If you are reproached for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. (1 Peter 4:14)
29. All these are inspired by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills. (1 Corinthians 12:11)
30. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. (Psalms 51:10)

6. Holy Church (*Sabha*)

1. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the powers of death shall not prevail against it. (St. Matthew 16:18)

2. If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a gentile and a tax collector. (St. Matthew 18:17)
3. Which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all. (Ephesians 1:23)
4. Built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone. (Ephesians 2:20)
5. I have other sheep that are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they will heed my voice. So there shall be one flock, one shepherd. (St. John 10:16)
6. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. (1 Peter 2:9)
7. For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church. (Ephesians 5:23)
8. The two shall become one flesh. This mystery is a profound one, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. (Ephesians 5:31,32)
9. And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. (Revelation 21:2)
10. Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. (Colossians 1:24)
11. For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 3:11)
12. He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. (Ephesians 5:26,27)
13. And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they believed. (Acts 14:23)
14. The Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved. (Acts 2:47)
15. Take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God which he obtained with the blood of his own Son. (Acts 20:28)

7. Holy Baptism

1. I will sprinkle clean water upon you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses. (Ezekiel 36:25)

2. John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 1:5)
3. Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. (St. John 3:5)
4. You have been born anew, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding word of God. (1 Peter 1:23)
5. If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has passed away, behold, the new has come. (2 Corinthians 5:17)
6. To all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God. (St. John 1:12)
7. He who believes and is baptised will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. (St. Mark 16:16)
8. Peter said to them, Repent, and be baptised every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:38)
9. Do you not know that all of us who have been baptised into Christ Jesus were baptised into his death? (Romans 6:3)
10. For as many of you as were baptised into Christ have put on Christ. (Galatians 3:27)
11. No one born of God commits sin; for God's nature abides in him, and he cannot sin because he is born of God. (1 John 3:9)
12. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. (St. Matthew 28:19)
13. One Lord, one faith, one baptism. (Ephesians 4:5)
14. He (*Jesus Christ*) will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. (St. Matthew 3:11)
15. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he said, John baptised with water, but you shall be baptised with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 11:16)
16. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body - Jews or Greeks, slaves or free - and all were made to drink of one Spirit. (1 Corinthians 12:13)
17. He poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our saviour, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life. (Titus 3:6,7)

Basis of Infant Baptism

18. And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the babe leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. (St. Luke 1:41)
19. Jesus saw their faith he said to the paralytic, "Take heart, my son; your sins are forgiven." (St. Matthew 9:2)

20. Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire." And her daughter was healed instantly. (St. Matthew 15:28)
21. Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God. (St. Mark 10:14)
22. The promise (*gift of the Holy Spirit*) is to you and to your children and to all that are far off, every one whom the Lord our God calls to him. (Acts 2:39)
23. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it. (St. Mark 10:15)
24. He (*John the Baptist*) will be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb. (St. Luke 1:15)
25. Like newborn babes, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up to salvation. (1 Peter 2:2)
26. She (*Lydia*) was baptised, with her household. (Acts 16:15)
27. I (*St. Paul*) did baptise also the household of Stephanas. (1 Corinthians 1:16)

8. Holy Chrism (*Mooron*)

1. He (*Moses*) poured some of the anointing oil on Aaron's head, and anointed him, to consecrate him. (Leviticus 8:12)
2. Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brothers; and the Spirit of the Lord came mightily upon David from that day forward. (1 Samuel 16:13)
3. Jehu the son of Nimshi you shall anoint to be king over Israel; and Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah you shall anoint to be prophet in your place. (1 Kings 19:16)
4. Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit. (Acts 8:17)
5. But you have been anointed by the Holy One, and you all know. (1 John 2:20)
6. It is God who establishes us with you in Christ, and has commissioned us. (2 Corinthians 1:21)
7. I have found David, my servant; with my holy oil I have anointed him. (Psalms 89:20)
8. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of my enemies; thou anointest my head with oil, my cup overflows. (Psalms 23:5)

9. Holy Eucharist (*Qurbana*)

1. In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." (1 Corinthians 11:25)
2. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. (St. John 6: 56)
3. The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? (1 Corinthians 10:16)
4. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself. (1 Corinthians 11:29)
5. As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me. (St. John 6: 57)
6. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. (St. John 6: 54)
7. And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. (Acts 2:42)
8. On the first day of the week, when we were gathered together to break bread, Paul talked with them, intending to depart on the next day; and he prolonged his speech until midnight. (Acts 20:7)
9. For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. (1 Corinthians 11:26)
10. Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." (St. Matthew 26: 26)
11. This is the bread which came down from heaven, not such as the fathers ate and died; he who eats this bread will live for ever." (St. John 6: 58)
12. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. (1 Corinthians 11:28)
13. God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. (1 Corinthians 1:9)
14. Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. (1 Corinthians 10:17)

10. Holy Confession

1. When a man is guilty in any of these, he shall confess the sin he has committed. (Leviticus 5:5)
2. He who conceals his transgressions will not prosper, but he who confesses and forsakes them will obtain mercy. (Proverbs 28:13)

3. Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. Blessed is the man to whom the Lord imputes no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit. (Psalms 32:1-2)
4. The Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins. (St. Matthew 9:6)
5. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (St. Matthew 16:19)
6. Truly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. (St. Matthew 18:18)
7. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained. (St. John 20:23)
8. They were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. (St. Matthew 3:6)
9. Many also of those who were now believers came, confessing and divulging their practices. (Acts 19:18)
10. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)
11. Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool. (Isaiah 1:18)
12. Anyone who comes to me I will not cast out. (St. John 6:37)
13. There will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance. (St. Luke 15:7)
14. There is joy before the angels of God over one sinner who repents. (St. Luke 15:10)
15. Take heed to yourselves; if your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him. (St. Luke 17:3)
16. Repent therefore of this wickedness of yours, and pray to the Lord that, if possible, the intent of your heart may be forgiven you. (Acts 8:22)
17. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners. (St. Matthew 9:13)

11. Holy Priesthood

1. Thou art a priest for ever, after the order of Melchizedek. (Hebrews 5:6)
2. And one does not take the honour upon himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was. (Hebrews 5:4)
3. Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. (St. Matthew 4:19)

4. And when it was day, he called his disciples, and chose from them twelve, whom he named apostles. (St. Luke 6:13)
5. And he said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation." (St. Mark 16:15)
6. This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. (1 Corinthians 4:1)
7. Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off. (Acts 13:3)
8. And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they believed. (Acts 14:23)
9. Not as domineering over those in your charge but being examples to the flock. (1 Peter 5:3)
10. Let the elders who rule well be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who labour in preaching and teaching. (1 Timothy 5:17)
11. Let him who is taught the word share all good things with him who teaches. (Galatians 6:6)
12. Purify yourselves, you who bear the vessels of the Lord. (Isaiah 52:11)
13. They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. (1 Timothy 3:9)
14. They offer the offerings by fire to the Lord, the bread of their God; therefore they shall be holy. (Leviticus 21:6)
15. And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but kindly to every one, an apt teacher, forbearing. (2 Timothy 2:24)

12. Holy Matrimony

1. Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him." (Genesis 2:18)
2. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. (St. Mark 10:6)
3. So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man put asunder. (St. Matthew 19:6)
4. As the church is subject to Christ, so let wives also be subject in everything to their husbands. (Ephesians 5:24)

7. Wisdom builds her house, but folly with her own hands tears it down. (Proverbs 14:1)
8. Jesus also was invited to the marriage, with his disciples. (St. John 2:2)
9. Let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband. (Ephesians 5:33)
10. Wives, be subject to your husbands, as is fitting in the Lord. (Colossians 3:18)
11. Husbands, love your wives, and do not be harsh with them. (Colossians 3:19)

13. Anointment of Oil for Sick

1. And they cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many that were sick and healed them. (St. Mark 6:13)
2. Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. (St. James 5:14)
3. The prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. (St. James 5:15)
4. Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. (St. James 5:16)
5. The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effects. (St. James 5:16)
6. It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be made manifest in him. (St. John 9:3)

14. Prayer

1. Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. (St. Matthew 7:7)
2. Pray constantly. (1 Thessalonians 5:17)
3. Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. (St. Mark 11:24)
4. We receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. (1 John 3:22)
5. Whatever you ask in my name, I will do it, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. (St. John 14:13)
6. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth. (St. John 4:24)

7. If two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. (St. Matthew 18:19)
8. For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them. (St. Matthew 18:20)
9. And in praying do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard for their many words. (St. Matthew 6:7)
10. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions. (St. James 4:3)
11. Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. (St. Matthew 26:41)
12. And in the morning, a great while before day, he rose and went out to a lonely place, and there he prayed. (St. Mark 1:35)
13. And after he had taken leave of them, he went up on the mountain to pray. (St. Mark 6:46)
14. In these days he went out to the mountain to pray; and all night he continued in prayer to God. (St. Luke 6:12)
15. And Jesus lifted up his eyes and said, "Father, I thank thee that thou hast heard me." (St. John 11:41)
16. Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. (St. Luke 23:34)
17. Father, into thy hands I commit my spirit. (St. Luke 23:46)
18. And whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive, if you have faith. (St. Matthew 21:22)
19. This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer. (St. Mark 9:29)
20. Bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. (St. Luke 6:28)
21. And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. (Acts 2:42)
22. Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is any cheerful? Let him sing praise. (St. James 5:13)
23. The prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. (St. James 5:15)
24. The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effects. (St. James 5:16)
25. The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the Lord, but the prayer of the upright is his delight. (Proverbs 15:8)
26. The Lord is near to all who call upon him, to all who call upon him in truth. (Psalms 145:18)

3. And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them. (Jonah 3:5)
4. He (Elijah) arose, and ate and drank, and went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God. (1 Kings 19:8)
5. And he fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterward he was hungry. (St. Matthew 4:2)
6. While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." (Acts 13:2)
7. The days will come, when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast in that day. (St. Mark 2:20)
8. Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning. (Joel 2:12)
9. I pommel my body and subdue it, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified. (1 Corinthians 9:27)
10. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. (Galatians 5:24)
11. This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer. (St. Mark 9:29)

5. The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life, that one may avoid the snares of death. (Proverbs 14:27)
6. Better is a little with the fear of the Lord than great treasure and trouble with it. (Proverbs 15:16)
7. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained from the world. (St. James 1:27)
8. Indeed all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted. (2 Timothy 3:12)
9. The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; a good understanding have all those who practice it. His praise endures for ever! (Psalms 111:11)
10. The reward for humility and fear of the Lord is riches and honour and life. (Proverbs 22:4)
11. The fear of the Lord leads to life; and he who has it rests satisfied; he will not be visited by harm. (Proverbs 19:23)

4. Not every one who says to me, 'Lord, Lord', shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. (St. Matthew 7:21)
5. Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it! (St. Luke 11:28)

6. My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and do it. (St. Luke 8:21)
7. The word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. (Hebrews 4:12)
8. Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God; consider the outcome of their life, and imitate their faith. (Hebrews 13:7)
9. He who gives heed to the word will prosper, and happy is he who trusts in the Lord. (Proverbs 16:20)

6. Who is it that overcomes the world but he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? (1 John 5:5)
7. For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that overcomes the world, our faith. (1 John 5:4)
8. Besides all these, taking the shield of faith, with which you can quench all the flaming darts of the evil one. (Ephesians 6:16)
9. If you would believe you would see the glory of God. (St. John 11:40)
10. All things are possible to him who believes. (St. Mark 9:23)
11. He believed the Lord; and he reckoned it to him as righteousness. (Genesis 15:6)
12. He who through faith is righteous shall live. (Romans 1:17)
13. Faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. (St. James 2:17)
14. God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. (St. John 3:16)
15. Looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. (Hebrews 12:2)
16. Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. (St. Mark 11:24)
17. This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent. (St. John 6:29)
18. By grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God. (Ephesians 2:8)
19. Whom God put forward as an expiation by his blood, to be received by faith. (Romans 3:25)
20. All the prophets bear witness that every one who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name. (Acts 10:43)

5. Nevertheless do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you; but rejoice that your names are written in heaven. (St. Luke 10: 20)
6. Heaven is my throne and the earth is my footstool; what is the house which you would build for me, and what is the place of my rest? (Isaiah 66:1)
7. The wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and wickedness of men who by their wickedness suppress the truth. (Romans 1:18)
8. Is not God high in the heavens? See the highest stars, how lofty they are! (Job 22:12)
9. I say to you, Do not swear at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God. (St. Matthew 5:34)


